All cardinal signs are considered the same. So, Uranian astrology is very different, using a 90 degree wheel rather than 360 degree wheel.

00:59:38 Merriman Market Analyst: Our focus will be upon the "hard aspects" of conjunction, squares and oppositions, but also the 1/3 cycle, or the trine. The studies indicate that each of these are most important, Sextile not as consistent with long term cycle culminations.

If I am applying it to mundane events, I like the orb to be tighter, say 3 degrees. Market highs and lows show up best if using very tight orbs,
