

RESEARCH PROJECT IDEAS FOR MMTA COURSE TWO

- Pick a market with at least 25 years of data
 1. Identify all 4-year or greater cycles in a market.
 2. Identify the phases within it (2-phase, 3-phase, combination), such as 23- and 33-month half cycles in stock indices and currencies, or their 16- or 22.5-month 1/3 cycle phases.
 3. Identify any half- or 1/3 cycle phases within those, such as 50-week cycles.
- Next, identify the dates of all the Saturn/Uranus/Neptune/Pluto aspects onto it (major aspects, such as conjunction, square, trine, and opposition). If you are pressed for time, just pick one planetary pair combination involving Saturn to one of the other three planets.
 1. Identify the central time band if there are multiple passes.
 2. Draw lines on the chart showing these periods with an orb of up to 10 months outside the central time band.
- Pick one planetary pair combination of Saturn to a planet outside of its orbit (Uranus, Neptune, Pluto). You may also choose Jupiter/Saturn if you wish.
 1. Do a C/S study of those planetary pair cycles.
 2. Organize it by aspect type, such as conjunction first, waxing square second, etc.
 3. Next to the date of the aspect, indicate the type of cycle it corresponded to, and its 'S' Strength value.
 4. Create 'S' values along the lines that we used in Course 2, i.e., cycle over 4 years = 5; 4-year cycles = 4. But your cycles may differ, so decide how you want to assign value to them. Longest cycles will be 5, their half cycles can be 4, and their 1/3 phases can be 3, etc. And DBs or DTs can be half-point lower.
 5. If you have time and feel ambitious, also list the dates (and cycles therein) of the sextile, semi-square, and sesquiquadrates involving Saturn to Uranus, Neptune, or Pluto – whichever pair you decided to analyze).
- Example: Crude Oil – identify all 17-month or greater cycles See if they are related to Jupiter/Neptune, vs Saturn/Pluto aspects.
