



## QUIZ ON LESSON 1 GLOSSARY TERMS

1. What is a lunar ingress, and how often does it occur?

**The time in which the Moon transits from one sign to the next. A lunar ingress occurs about every 2.5 days.**

2. What is an isolated low?

**The lowest price of the bar is lower than the bar before it and the bar after it.**

3. What is an isolated high?

**The highest price of the bar is higher than the bar before it and the bar after it.**

4. True or false: An isolated low always occurs at a cycle trough and an isolated high always occurs at a cycle crest.

**True**

5. What does a “baseline” refer to in terms of a financial astrological research study?

**The total number of days used in a study, from the first date to the last date from which the study took place. If a study covered a period from January 1, 2011 through January 1, 2021, the baseline would be 10 years.**

6. What does “rate of frequency” refer to in terms of an astrological research study on financial markets?

**It refers to how many times a criterion was achieved during a particular time band.**

7. How are “weighted values” calculated in this course?

**Dividing the rate of frequency of each planet in each sign (in percentage terms) by the baseline totals for each planet-sign combination (in percentage terms).**

8. What does a “weighted value” score of 100 mean?

**Criterion was achieved exactly as expected.**

9. What does a “weighted value” score of over 150 suggest?

**Very important in terms of significance.**

10. What does a weighted value score of less than 50 suggest?

**Not very important in terms of significance.**

1. How often does the Moon change signs?

**Approximately every 2.5 days.**

2. Which Moon signs tend to correspond to highs in U.S. stock indices from which declines follow?

**Gemini, Leo, Libra, Sagittarius, Aquarius**

3. Which Moon signs tend to correspond to lows in U.S. stock indices from which rallies follow?

**Taurus, Virgo, Scorpio (somewhat), Capricorn, Pisces**

4. Which Moon signs tend to correspond to highs in precious metals from which declines follow?

**Aries, early-Cancer, Virgo, Sagittarius**

5. Which Moon signs tend to correspond to lows in precious metals from which rallies follow?

**Taurus, early-Leo, Capricorn, Pisces**

6. Which combination of Sun-Moon signs (by element) tends to be unpredictable, but also correlate with sharp sell-offs in Silver about 1/3 of the time?

**Air-Air**

7. True or false: Moon signs are a more dominant factor in daily price activity than planets in aspect.

## **QUIZ #4-5 WEIGHTED VALUES**

1. What does “baseline” refer to in regards to the studies conducted in Course 4?

**The total number of trading days in which each planet was in each sign from the start date of the study through the end date of the study.**

2. How are weighted values calculated in MMTA?

**Dividing the rate of frequency of each planet in each sign (in percentage terms) by the baseline totals for each planet-sign combination (in percentage terms).**

3. What weighted value scores are considered important as trading reversals– one-star types?

**>120**

4. What weighted value scores are considered very important as trading reversals – two-star types?

**>150**

5. What weighted value scores are considered extremely important as trading reversals – three-star types?

**>200**

6. What considerations could lower those levels and still be considered 1-, 2- or 3-star types?

**The more historical data that is used, the more the weighted value scores will drift toward 100. Very high numbers will decrease and very low numbers will increase, as a rule, as additional new dates are added to the study.**

7. What weighted value scores are considered less important as reversal signatures– one-# types? two-# types? three-# types?

**Any result under 83.3% as potentially weak as a geocosmic reversal signature; a result of under 66.7% is very weak, and a result under 50% as extremely weak.**

8. In determining whether an important reversal signature is primarily a crest or trough indicator, what considerations must be taken into account?

**Must compare weighted values of both crests and troughs for the same planet-sign combination. It is only important if they are 1) above 120 and 2) significantly different in values to one another.**

## SOLAR-LUNAR COMBINATIONS QUIZ #6

1. Why is it important to segregate Sun signs and then look at the Moon signs, rather than look only at Moon signs, regardless of what sign the Sun is in?

**Due to the phasing of the Moon, which differs depending on the sign the Sun is in.**

2. In the 40-year study of the DJIA shown in this chapter, what phase of the lunar cycle had the highest correlation to 4% or greater reversals when the Sun was in Libra?

**Libra: 170.6 (new moon)**

3. In the 40-year study of the DJIA shown in this chapter, what phase of the lunar cycle had the second highest correlation to 4% or greater reversals when the Sun was in Libra?

**Sagittarius 152.8 (waxing phase)**

4. In the 40-year study of the DJIA shown in this chapter, what phase of the lunar cycle had the highest correlation to 4% or greater reversals *from a crest* when the Sun was in Libra? That is, which phase of the Moon had the highest correlation to crests in the studies shown in this lesson?

**Scorpio: 228.9**

5. Besides the distribution of Moon signs, what other planetary distributions are important when isolating just the Sun sign for study? Why?

**One may also find strong correlations to reversals based on the Sun-Mercury or even Sun-Venus combinations. After all, in geocentric astrology, Mercury never moves more than one sign away from the Sun sign and Venus never moves more than two signs away. Thus, certain combinations of Sun-Mercury or Sun-Venus signs can also highlight certain periods when a greater than usual number of reversals will take place.**

6. When the Sun was in Libra, what sign was Venus in when the highest weighted value scores were achieved for 4% reversals in the DJIA over the past 40-years? When will that next take place?

**Sagittarius 186.8 (Venus is there now)**
