

**FINAL MMTA RESEARCH PROJECT
WRITING A MONTHLY, QUARTERLY, OR ANNUAL MARKET REPORT
DUE AUG 21**

INTRO: This is where you put the concepts of long- and intermediate-term market timing concepts all together, as learned in your 2-year MMTA Market Timing Program.

This is where Gianni and I learn whether or not we have been effective instructors, and you have been ardent, determined, hardworking, and enthusiastic students for learning these concepts of market timing.

Since I believe long-term cycles and their trends are the key to building wealth, I would like this final research project to be one where you create a report, an investment plan, that enables you (and readers) to firmly create a vision where and when the best investment opportunities lie ahead in the future, and to keep that longer-term picture always in your mind and that of your clients.

PROJECT: Review your long-term and intermediate-term studies, both of market cycles and their intermediate-term phases, even down to primary cycle. Then, draft a report of your findings/studies, identifying the length of these cycle, its orb, and when it is next due from a long-term perspective (5-year and greater cycles). Based on your findings and when the next long-term cycle is coming due, what do you advise the investor to do now? When would you be looking to take a different course of action?

The next step would be to look at intermediate-term cycle phases of the shortest long-term cycle. What intermediate-term cycle phase of the longer-term cycle is it in? First, second, or third? When is it due to bottom? What is the strategy to employ now and when the cycle is due?

ORGANIZATION: I would like you to follow the structure for writing this long and intermediate-term cycle report as given in the classes. There are five steps.

1. Start with a review of what has happened in the past year (when was did the most recent long- or intermediate-term cycle that is effect now begin?).
2. Next, identify the long-term cycles trend – Basic and Moving Averages trend. Make your choice of moving averages for that trend study based on our lessons. So, select wisely and based on the length of those long-term cycles.
3. Next, discuss your long-term cycle studies. What is the periodicity of the long-term cycles found in your studies? When is it next due (same as discussed in intro)?
4. Next, discuss your long-term geocosmic cycles that are under way or coming up.
5. Next, provide price targets for these lows and highs. What are those based on (should be your historical studies).

If you are more comfortable moving step 2 to follow step 4 as given above, that is OK.

Then do the same for intermediate-term cycles.

Here you will follow the same script as above, but now add any chart patterns or technical studies that show up on the weekly.

Do this down to the primary cycle. What phase of the intermediate-term cycle is this current primary cycle? When is it due? Where do Cycles and Geocosmics overlap time-wise. Price targets? Chart patterns and technicals?

You do not need to do the primary cycle phases. We just want a sense of when the next position trading opportunity is due, as well as intermediate-term and long-term investment opportunities.

CONCLUSIONS AND STRATEGIES FOR PRIMARY CYCLE POSITION TRADERS, INTERMEDIATE-TERM AND LONG-TERM INVESTORS.

End your report, or each section, with Strategies for that type of investor or trader.

INCLUDE CHARTS OF MONTHLY, WEEKLY, AND DAILY with their cycles notated.

You are writing an investment and trading report on your favorite market that you have been researching. This project is to steer you into experiencing what it is like to be market analyst – for your own company or even for another company should you find a firm looking for such a skill.

This market report will be between 5-10 pages (with charts). Try to keep it crisp and to the point, for reports of any market that are too long to read do not get read. In our monthly report or Special Reports on a market, an analysis of the stock market or previous metals markets may be about 5 pages. The yearly reports may be closer to ten pages. Try to keep it in that parameter if possible. Note that this is a market report, not specifically a research report, but one that identifies the cycle lengths of your studies, and when those cycles are next due and what strategies to employ with this knowledge.

If you have not been working on a specific market throughout your studies, then please choose either DJIA or Gold or Silver.

FYI: Four or five of these reports may be published by MMA and sent to its subscribers at no cost. We will choose one from each of 4-5 markets that the majority of our subscribers are interested in (i.e., DJIA, S&P, NASDAQ, DAX, Shanghai SSE, Nikkei, Gold, Silver, Crude Oil, Copper, and/or Bitcoin). This will also serve as a marketing tool to excite interest in the MMTA 3 program which starts next Spring. A consent form is enclosed where you can let us know if you wish this or not with your report.

We will also be sending you an evaluation form sharing your experience as the graduating students of the MMTA 2 Academy. It seems like this class is really developing a good rapport and working relationship with one another. It is wonderful to see this coming together now.

I hope you have enjoyed seeing this transformation and coming together as much as Gianni and I have. And of course, I know the journey is just now beginning for many of you. And for many of us, it will never end. We will always be students learning from one another.
